1) Equipment and instruments are to be maintained in good repair and in a sanitary manner. Equipment is to be routinely inspected and any equipment that is rusty or in disrepair is to be discarded.
2) Reprocessing area shall allow for a one-way work flow of contaminated items.
3) After each use reuseable equipment must be thoroughly rinsed and then disinfected, to remove all debris, using an approved disinfectant as per the manufacturer's or Public Health Inspectors' instructions.

4) All equipment that are designed for single use must be discarded immediately after use.

5) Store all equipment and instruments in a manner to protect from contamination.

### **Final Report**

Date of final report: October 04, 2023

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Brief description of corrective measures taken:

1) During the initial inspection on September 19, 2023, all tools in the back reprocessing area were required to be re-cleaned and properly disinfected and single use items observed to be used were discarded during the inspection.

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2) A re-inspection was conducted September 20th to confirm the reprocessign area had been reorganized to allow for a one-way flow of dirty to clean equipment, all reusable equipment remained in sanitary manner, and further education provided on the importance of thorough reprocessing.

3) Fine issued September 22, 2023 for using equipment not kept in sanitary condition.
