Support for Bills S-233 and C-223 "An Act to develop a national framework for a guaranteed livable basic income"

Correspondence dated October 2, 2024 from Councillor Joy Lachica, Chair, Board of Health for Peterborough Public Health, addressed to the Prime Minister, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance, Minister of Health, House Leaders, and National Finance Committee, requesting support for a guaranteed livable basic income as a policy option for addressing poverty, crime and food insecurity, and for boosting opportunities for people with lower incomes.

Bills S-233 and C-233 "An Act to develop a national framework for a guaranteed livable basic income" are currently being considered by the Standing Senate Committee on National Finance and in the process of a second reading in the House of Commons. These Bills are designed to ensure progress toward developing a basic income model that will be effective in moving individuals and their families out of poverty.

Correspondence dated September 19, 2024 from David Marshall, Board of Health Chair for Haliburton, Kawartha, Pine Ridge District Health Unit addressed to the Prime Minister, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance, Minister of Health, House Leaders, and National Finance Committee, endorsing correspondence from Middlesex-London Health Unit urging support of Bills S-233 and C-223.

Inadequate income and household food insecurity result in poor health outcomes and higher healthcare costs. The Board of Health for HKPRDHU supports upstream income-based solutions such as guaranteed livable basic income as essential components to effectively reduce poverty and household food insecurity. Consideration of this important public health issue is appreciated.
