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Introduction – Dr. Linna Li, Leeds, Grenville & Lanark District Health Unit Medical Officer of Health

- You may be aware that Ontario has had 4 measles cases in the past 3 weeks, one of which may have been locally acquired. All have been in the greater Toronto area.
- Locally we haven't had any measles cases, but we've had a handful of investigations at the
 Health Unit and are seeing gaps in the system. Although our risk of local cases is low, I am
 expecting more measles cases in Ontario and it's a matter of chance as to where it lands
 (could be here!)—especially since March Break is coming.
