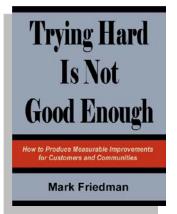

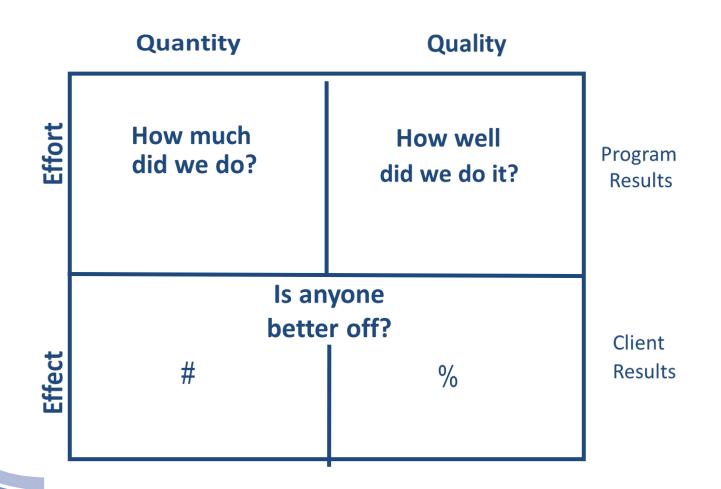

An Example

Performance Measure	 # high-risk SDWS inspected within the timeframe # SDWS with the risk level lowered # Class A pools inspected within the required timeframe
Population Indicator	Water-borne disease incidence
Population Outcome	 Water-borne illness risks are mitigated Public exposure to water-related illnesses and hazards is reduced

Selecting Indicators

Indicator	Consideration
Communication power	Does it speak to a broad & diverse audience?
Data power	Is quality data available on a timely basis?
Proxy power	Does it really measure the issue? Is it a good proxy for other indicators?
Public health importance	Does it relate to an important question/service?
Local data	Is data available at the Health Unit level?
Implication	Is there something we can do about?
